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UTILITIES: ELECTRICITY, WATER AND GAS, INTERNET

Electricity, Water and Gas, Internet

Your electricity, gas, and water will not be shut off if you cannot pay the bill.

PECO has instructed customers who have a disconnect notice or late fees to call 1-800-494.4000

The Philadelphia Water Department will restore service to customers whose service had already been disconnected. There will be no reactivation fee. This in effect until May 15.

When Philadelphia public schools are closed, all students can still pick up two meals a day:

- · Available at certain schools
- Monday through Friday, from 9:00 AM 12:00 PM: TWO Grab-and-go meals for students.
- You do not need to go to your child's school. You can go to the school closest to your home to pick up your meals.

Recreation centers and gyms:

- Some recreation centers and gyms will be open to youth Monday through Friday from 10:00 AM – 6:00 PM
- One meal per child will be provided at 3:00 PM

Public food sites:

- Sites are open Mondays and Thursdays from 10:00 AM – 12:00 PM
- Residents can pick up one box per household.
 Supplies will last up to five days.
- Residents do not need to present an ID or proof of income for eligibility

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PUBLIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS (PENNSYLVANIA)

Applying for Public Assistance Programs

All county assistance offices (CAOs) in PA are closed to the public beginning Tuesday, March 17. They will continue to accept and process Medical Assistance applications online at https://www.compass.state.pa.us/compass.web/Public/CMPHome

Individuals can notate on the application if they have a health emergency including COVID-19. Medical Assistance applications where there is an immediate health concern will continue to be prioritized. (PA DHS COVID-19 Response, Guidance, and Actions 3/17/20)

Medicaid (MA) and CHIP

- If you have an issue with Medicaid, you can reach the Health and Independence Unit at 215.227-2400, Monday, Wednesday, and Friday 9 AM – 5 PM
- The MA and CHIP programs will pay for COVID-19 testing when a health care practitioner determines it is needed, and prior authorization is not required.
- There are no MA or CHIP copayments for lab testing for COVID-19. For those services that do have copayments, MA providers may not deny services if a beneficiary is unable to pay the copayment. (https://www.media.pa.gov/pages/DHS_details.aspx?newsid=491)

SNAP (Food Stamps)

SNAP certification periods will be extended at least for the next three months so SNAP cases will not be terminated during this period. (PA DHS COVID-19 Response, Guidance, and Actions 3/17/20)

WIC -Philadelphia

- Recipients should call the WIC office first as they may
 be able to offer some flexibility in the timing of their
 appointment. They can also complete some of the
 paperwork over the phone to reduce time spent at
 the office.
- Someone must physically come to the office to provide ID, EBT card, and any supporting documents. This can be the recipient or a proxy (with ID) who has been identified beforehand over the phone.
- Due to COVID-19, recipients/proxies are asked to come alone. They will not enter the office. They will put cards/ documents in a dropbox and call the office to alert them. They will wait outside until staff have processed and sanitized the cards, which will then be put back in the dropbox for recipients to retrieve.
- Recipients receive 3 months' worth of supplies, as is standard.
- If WIC products aren't available at grocery stores, no substitutions are being accepted at this time.
- · WIC cannot deliver food.

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Housing

You can contact one of the city's housing counseling agencies (https://www.phila.gov/departments/division-of-housing-and-community-development/neighborhood-resources/housing-counseling/) with issues and questions.

Eviction and Foreclosure

- All eviction and lockout proceedings have been suspended until at least 3/29. Your landlord cannot legally try to remove you from your home during this time. More information can be found through Community Legal Services (https://clsphila.org/ housing/homeownership-pandemic/).
- Most mortgage and tax foreclosure proceedings have been suspended. If you are unable to pay your mortgage, contact your lender to see if they are willing to adjust monthly payments.
- Homeowners concerned about foreclosure can call the Save Your Home Philly hotline at 214.334-HOME (215-334-4663).

Homelessness

The City's homeless intake centers (housing/find-emergency-housing/) are open. There are specific resources available for survivors of domestic violence (https://www.womenagainstabuse.org/get-help/pdvh) and youth ages 12-17 (https://philadelphiaofficeofhomelessservices.org/services/).
